Leonard's "One Man's Library, Manila, 1583" appeared not only in 1947 in the journal mentioned under item 108, but also later in Irving's erudite and entertaining *Books of the Brave* (Harvard University Press, 1949). Almost all the 283 entries have been annotated, and Dr. Hart deserves congratulations both on the arrangement of his work and on the high quality of his comments. The volume also reveals the impressive amount of bibliographical effort made by the National Library of the Philippines and the University of the Philippines in recent years.

Indian music, and by the fourteen clear photographs at the end. The only desiderata are the following: (a) A not-too-technical statement at the very beginning on the contemporary musical scene in India would have aided the reader by providing a perspective and an indication of the direction in which the author planned to move. (b) At least a passing reference should have been made to classical music in "film" songs. (c) The account of the *gharānās* should have mentioned singers like Kumār Gandharva who have crossed traditional boundaries. (d) The transliteration of Indian names and terms is often imprecise, particularly in the later chapters. (e) All abbreviations should have been explained; as matters stand the author explains only the abbreviations of the names of works on music.
